MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR ELECTORAL PROGRAMS

As we have been describing in our works, the institutional meta-mafia has taken us to the point of no return of decadence, that is, if a substantial change in the system is not made, poverty and corruption will be greater every day, worsening our present and our future for decades. Likewise, the institutional metamafia, including its international organizations, promote totalitarian regimes, especially since the declaration of pandemic by the WHO (UN) in 2020.

The only solution to the decadence consists in diminishing and controlling the power of the institutional meta-mafia; therefore, it is necessary that the population vote only for political parties that are committed to this change.

Both the curbing of decadence and totalitarianism, as well as the change of the system, can only be achieved from the social sector. The social sector is made up of private non-profit organizations, and therefore represents civil society and the population as a whole.

For the containment of decadence and the realization of the necessary social change, electoral programs must contain the following commitments:

- 1) Civil society must be able to control the institutions.
- 2) The institutional meta-mafia cannot have any control over the social sector. The social sector must create its own rules and registers of organizations, outside the institutions.
- 3) The creation of a private financing and control structure for the social sector will be promoted, which will distribute the 0.7 of GDP plus another 0.7 of GDP that is currently allocated by the institutions to the social sector in Spain.
- 4) Judges, as the last guarantee of the control of legality, must be controlled by civil society as established by the Cortes de Cádiz of 1812 (La Pepa), that is, being popular courts who judge the prevarication of judges, limiting it to final sentences, provided that these have been appealed in another instance.
- 5) Judicial prevarication shall be considered when a judge dismisses an appeal where the article not complied with by the challenged resolution is referred to.
- 6) It shall be considered administrative malfeasance when an official dismisses an appeal where the article not complied with by the challenged resolution is referred to.
- 7) Any interference in the social sector, such as the constitution of associations, foundations or any other type of private non-profit organization, as well as subsidies to any organization in the social sector, shall be considered administrative malfeasance.

- 8) Public deficit will be considered a serious crime.
- 9) Governments of countries with public debt exceeding 60% of GDP will commit to reduce debt by 2% per year.
- 10) The statute of limitations for crimes committed by public officials shall expire after fifteen years, beginning when the victims have all the related documentation requested.
- 11) All crimes committed by public officials shall be punishable by imprisonment.
- 12) The State Patrimonial Liability (RPE) is established in 10 years (currently in one year), since the victim has all the documentation.
- 13) The actions of private organizations will not be subject to administrative law, as is currently the case with professional associations.
- 14) Considering that international organizations (intermethampias) have become a danger to democracies and human rights, the financing and membership of such organizations will be discontinued, except for the United Nations Security Council.
- 15) If no political party includes these basic principles, the best option is active abstention.

Aware of the high level of corruption in large NPOs (Non-Profit Organizations), the International Association to Change the World is committed to drafting the necessary regulatory proposals for the self-governance of the social sector.
